Tools.

It takes time to learn to use them. At first, we're awkward, fumble-fingered, frustrated. This tool that was supposed to make things easier seems to get in the way.

As our young adult apprentices help build elements of campus they learn new skills and new tools. "You made it look so easy!" they say when they've watched me put in a few screws, then try themselves.

They struggle. And the grand secret is that the learning is in the struggle. They get better, more expert.

Soon, rather than focusing on the tool, they use it as an integrated extension of themself as their attention shifts from learning the tool back to the real purpose, the reason they needed the tool in the first place. The job to be done.



Perhaps you felt those same feelings as you began a new stage in educating yourself or your children. Perhaps you thought, looking at someone with more experience, "You make it look so easy!"

Maybe, when you found new tools such as Libraries of Hope and the rotation schedule, you felt awkward, fumble-fingered, frustrated. Maybe you feel that way now. You struggle.

But the learning is in the struggle. As you keep using the tools, you get better -- more expert.

Soon, the tools become an integrated part of yourself rather than the focus of your attention, and you're able to put all your energy and focus back on the main thing. The job to be done: the softening, refining, and education of your own heart and the hearts of your children.

--I've been thinking about a quote someone posted recently from Maslow:

"Education through Art, may be especially important not so much for turning out artists or art products, as for turning out better people...

"If we have clearly in our mind the educational goals for human beings...if we hope for our children that they will become full human beings...then, as nearly as I can make out, the only kind of education in existence today that has any faint inkling of such goals is Art Education."

We keep saying WEH is different. I think this sums up the difference. We are human BEings, not human DOings and our focus is on BEing which is why this is an Art-based learning platform. Jesus taught the BEattitudes, not

the DOattitudes. We want our kids to be kind, be faithful, be loving, be curious, be creative, be humble, be meek. Yet the most often asked question here is: How do I DO this? Just tell me what to DO.

In fact, the #1 reason moms leave is because they feel like they aren't DOing enough and they panic and buy an open-and-go curriculum so they can feel like they are DOing something. They feel a tremendous need to DO school.

And yet those DOings actually work against this state of BEing that we are working towards.

This state of being can't be tested or measured or even directly planned. But as you consistently provide a rich environment of learning filled with music, art, poetry and story and spend as much time outside in God's classroom, you start to see the ripening fruit.

It is from that state of BEing that our actions are governed. Not the other way around.

No enduring masterpiece of literature was written because a writer paid strict attention to correctly spelled words or perfectly constructed sentences. Rather, it first poured out of a very full heart.

That is the Pattern for Learning and Creation that is the very heart of WEH: first tend to the heart through the Arts. The academic skills are secondary.

In a world riddled with attention deficit disorders, the Arts slow us down and help us pay attention. It is only as we pay attention that we grow to love something.

Like Charlotte Mason taught, it isn't how much our kids know that matters nearly as much as how many things they care about.

I know WEH can feel like a lonely road...that's why we have created community so that you can find like-minded

families and walk a different path with someone else.

In the days to come, I see your children as being the leaven, the salt, the candle in the darkness in a world that is growing 'past feeling.'

Belle Ame means 'Beautiful Soul.' We are in the business of growing beautiful eternal souls, not global workers for a global economy. That requires a different course. I pray for you every day.

--Month 2 includes a study of Brave Little Holland. Today I want to highlight <u>podcast #26</u> of lessons I learned from her and her fight for freedom. Her story is so similar to America's story. In fact, the Dutch influenced many of our Founders.

Just as our Republic was being born, Holland's Republic was in decline. It is worth noting the reasons:

There was too much concentration into the central government. The political machinery became clogged and at times almost suffered paralysis. Among the people, a spirit of luxury and extravagance took hold. They became weakened in old earnestness, integrity, devotion to high principles, sound ideas of honor, reverence for women, frugality and temperance. A money-loving spirit increased. Religion became formal. Manners declined. The love of strong liquors increased. Commerce, credit, the navy and army declined. The virtues of republican faith in God, high motives, grand actions, and simplicity in dress, food, and life had fallen to common levels.

Does anything sound familiar?

So is there hope for us? Can we turn things around? I close the podcast on a note of hope.
